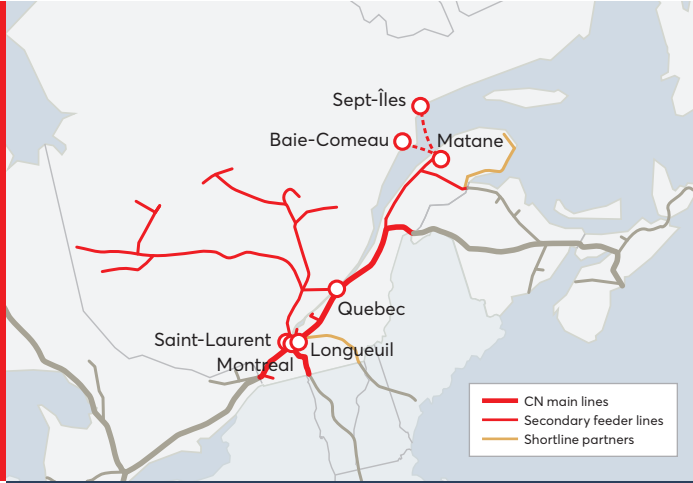

Our extensive rail network stretches across Quebec. Montreal is home to CN's headquarters and more than 2,800 employees as well as a major rail classification yard and repair shops. CN serves the Port of Montreal, where we handle growing numbers of import/export containers. We also have an intermodal terminal in Saint-Laurent. Other CN facilities in Montreal include a logistics park, forest products, automotive and metals distribution centres, and a CargoFlo® bulk handling facility. Quebec City boasts metals, automotive and forest products distribution centres as well as a large rail classification yard.

Network Investments

Over the past decade, CN has invested about \$3.6 billion to build and maintain a safe and efficient network in Quebec and to support our supply chain partners. Expansion projects included the development of several major I&T projects. Maintenance projects focused on the replacement of rail and ties, plus upkeep of crossings, bridges, culverts, signals, and other track infrastructure.

Community Partnerships

In 2022, CN contributed to many Quebec-based organizations, including:

UNITED WAY OF GREATER MONTREAL CN donated \$300,000 to the United Way of Greater Montreal's new Equity, Diversity and Inclusion Fund. The EDI Fund addresses the needs of marginalized people who are at a greater risk of poverty and social exclusion, such as newcomers, racialized people, people with disabilities, or LGBTQ2S+ and Indigenous communities.

L'APPART À MOI L'Appart à Moi (My Apartment) provides vulnerable young adults affected with Down Syndrome or other intellectual disabilities a smooth and harmonious transition to independent living. CN signed a three-year agreement (2020–2022) to help build L'Appart à Moi's future.

MONTREAL HOSPITALS CN has signed 10-year agreements (2018–2027) to provide stable funding to four of Montreal's top research hospitals: Centre hospitalier de l'Université de Montréal, McGill University Healthcare Centre, Montreal Heart Institute and Centre hospitalier universitaire Sainte-Justine.

CANADIAN RAILWAY MUSEUM Located in Saint-Constant, the Canadian Railway Museum's Exporail celebrated 60 years of education and preservation of Canada's railway heritage.

PEOPLE EXPERIENCING HOMELESSNESS CN supports many organizations in Montreal that help people experiencing homelessness, including the Native Women Shelter of Montreal, Refuge pour Femmes Chez Doris, Mission Old Brewery, Welcome Hall Mission, Nazareth Community, and Le Bon Dieu dans la rue.

MONTMAGNY PUMP TRACK CN supported the development of a BMX pump track in Montmagny, the only such facility in the region, to help the young people of Montmagny and the surrounding communities adopt healthy lifestyle habits in a fun and stimulating environment.
