Nova Scotia is home to the Port of Halifax, where CN handles all rail-served containers imported and exported through the marine facility. Halifax is the site of a major autoport, where automotive vehicles imported from overseas enter North America for distribution across the continent. One of our intermodal terminals is also located in Halifax.

CN continues to offer a fast and fluid Eastern Canada solution for importers and exporters. For example, CN and PSA Halifax welcomed the *CMA CGM CHILE* to the Port of Halifax. The fresh produce carried by this ship moved by rail from Halifax to inland markets using CN's IntelliGen gensets to ensure temperature integrity and food safety throughout the journey. CN is the only intermodal service provider to offer temperature-controlled cargo service across Canada, the U.S. and Mexico.

Network Investments

Over the past decade, CN has invested more than \$150 million to build and maintain a safe and efficient network in Nova Scotia and to support our supply chain partners. The program focused on upgrades to bridges and the Autoport, the replacement of rail and ties, plus maintenance of public crossings, culverts, signal systems, and other track infrastructure.

IWK FOUNDATION CN's Atlantic Community Board donated to help the smallest patients in the neonatal and pediatric intensive care units at the IWK Health Centre in Halifax.

SOU'WEST NOVA TRANSIT ASSOCIATION CN contributed toward to an emergency transit fund for riders living in extreme poverty, riders facing special circumstances such as requesting transportation to a women's and children's emergency shelter, and/or riders who need extra help because they need to travel long distances to medical appointments.
