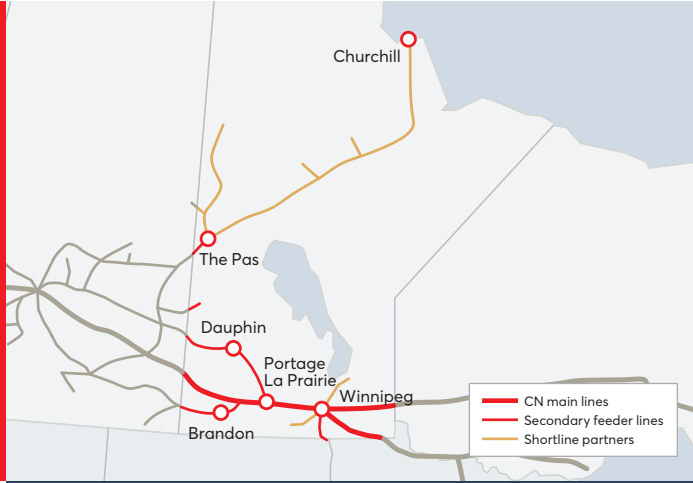

Manitoba is a major hub of CN's transcontinental rail network. Much of our traffic passes through Winnipeg's Symington Yard, our only hump yard in Western Canada. Winnipeg is also home to Transcona Shops, our main Canadian heavy railcar and locomotive repair facility, and our rail plant. Over 2,200 CN railroaders live and work in Winnipeg, where we also have CargoFlo® bulk handling and automotive distribution facilities, and an intermodal terminal.

CN's modern Claude Mongeau National Training Centre in Winnipeg is focused on instilling and reinforcing a strong safety culture in our new hires, experienced railroaders and customers who received a complete range of hands-on technical training.

Manitoba is the only Canadian province to enact Rail Safety Week into law, a most significant accomplishment that CN is extremely supportive of.

Network Investments

Over the past decade, CN has invested about \$1.3 billion to build and maintain a safe and efficient network in Manitoba and to support our supply chain partners. Projects focused on the replacement of rail and ties, plus upkeep of crossings, bridges, culverts, signals, and other track infrastructure.

Community Partnerships

In 2022, CN contributed to many Manitoba-based organizations, including:

THE FORKS FOUNDATION The Forks has been an historic gathering place for thousands of years, with a deep connection to the railway. CN proudly sponsors The Forks to bring free year-round community programming to CN Stage and Field, the epicentre for many of Winnipeg's biggest events. CN is excited to play a role in bringing people together and supporting the community.

HARVEST MANITOBA With the support of the Winnipeg Community Board, CN donated to Harvest Manitoba to help the food bank collect and share 12 million lbs of healthy and nutritious food to hungry Manitobans every year. With this food, volunteers prepare Harvest Hampers in the Winnipeg warehouse, which are then distributed to feed more than 90,000 Manitobans—hungry children, hardworking families and struggling adults—every month.

UKRAINIAN CANADIAN CONGRESS - MANITOBA COUNCIL As part of CN in Your Community Day, the Company donated to help Ukrainians fleeing the violence and devastation in their homeland due to Russia's invasion build a new life in Manitoba.

FESTIVAL DU VOYAGEUR Every winter since 1970, Saint-Boniface, Winnipeg's French quarter, is transformed into a winter wonderland and hosts the largest francophone event in Western Canada. The festival aims to promote *joie de vivre* and extend the reach of French language and culture throughout the year through artistic, educational, historical and cultural experiences inspired by the voyageur era. The 10-day celebration welcomes over 90,000 participants. CN donated to improve safety, security and signage at the festival park adjacent to our main line.

PORTAGE LA PRAIRIE COMMUNITY SKATE PARK CN helped to build a new community skate park in Portage La Prairie. The park is centrally located in an area where several families that struggle with income security live. This initiative is having a positive impact on the health and safety of the community as it promotes physical activity, fresh air and socialization.
