Forest products make up a significant part of the traffic originating or terminating in the province of New Brunswick. We also handle consumer goods and other intermodal traffic through our terminal in Moncton. Other CN facilities in Moncton include a major rail classification yard as well as an automotive distribution centre and a CargoFlo® bulk handling facility. CN's network extends to the ports of Belledune and Saint John, where we have another CargoFlo® bulk handling facility.

In partnership with the Port of Saint John, CN is committed to enabling supply chains and facilitating business in Atlantic Canada. Our new weekly CN IntelliGen Genset Service moves temperature-sensitive goods between Saint John, NB, and Brampton, ON.

Network Investments

Over the past decade, CN has invested more than \$250 million to build and maintain a safe and efficient network in New Brunswick and to support our supply chain partners. The program focused on bridge upgrades, the replacement of rail and ties, plus maintenance of public crossings, culverts, signal systems, and other track infrastructure.

Community Partnerships

In 2022, CN contributed to many New Brunswick-based organizations, including:

MONCTON UNIVERSITY CN has made a \$500,000 donation over five years (2022–2026) to an endowment research fund for applied genomics research in cancer.

INTANGIBLE CULTURE AND HERITAGE COUNCIL OF NEW BRUNSWICK The organization's mandate is to promote, protect and preserve the intangible culture and heritage of New Brunswick. CN is the presenting sponsor of Levee on the Lake, a festival in Sackville promoting local artists, traditional music and the crafts of Indigenous people, new immigrants as well as LGBTQ2+ and BIPOC voices.

Shore-Line Project, a proposed 150 km hiking and cycling route that will connect eight communities and the top three tourist attractions in New Brunswick via established corridors, including portions of former CN or Intercolonial rail lines.

FRIENDS OF THE MONCTON HOSPITAL FOUNDATION Children with multiple and complex health needs can spend a lot of time in the hospital. So can their families. That is why CN's Atlantic Community Board helped to create a new Complex Care Suite in the Pediatric Department at The Moncton Hospital.

WOODSTOCK FIRST NATION HEALTH CENTRE CN supported Woodstock's Indigenous Youth Outreach Program, a program that focuses on traditional healing, a cultural sense of belonging and teachings that promote healthy lifestyles that equip youth and community members with the abilities and resources to make empowered choices.
