Upcycled paper snowflakes

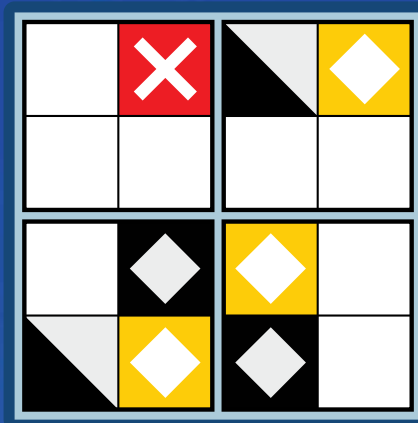

Unfold the paper to see your snowflake! Make a bunch of these as holiday decorations!
