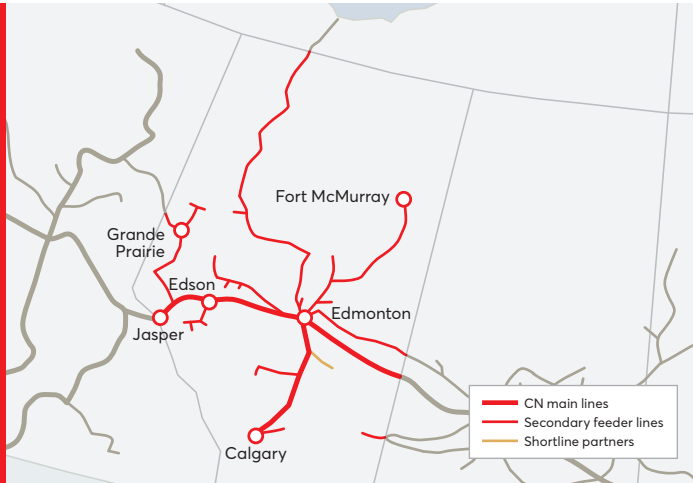

## TOP THREE COMMODITIES



CN handles growing amounts of intermodal container traffic through our Edmonton and Calgary terminals. In Edmonton, where close to 2,200 CN railroaders live and work, we have automotive distribution and CargoFlo® bulk handling facilities as well as metals and forest products distribution centres. In Calgary, which over 300 CN employees call home, you'll find our logistics park, automotive, metals and forest products distribution centres, and a CargoFlo® bulk handling facility. Edmonton and Calgary are also home to major rail classification yards. CN maintains large railcar and locomotive repair shops at Edmonton's Walker Yard. In Fort McMurray, there's a metals distribution centre and a CargoFlo® facility. We also have another forest products distribution centre in Edson.

## New Energy Solutions

We continue to make significant investments in our corridors between Edmonton and West Coast ports to support growth in propane, chemicals and other refined petroleum products. The Government of Alberta's incentive programs are encouraging the development of new petrochemical facilities in the province. CN and Keyera are exploring the development of a new high-throughput unit train rail terminal in Alberta's Industrial Heartland to support this growth. The new facility will aggregate a variety of energy products from area producers for transport to growing global markets.

## Network Investments

Over the past decade, CN has invested about \$2.7 billion to build and maintain a safe and efficient network in Alberta and to support our supply chain partners. Expansion projects included the construction of new and extended sidings as well as double-tracking sections of our main lines. Maintenance projects focused on the replacement of rail and ties, plus upkeep of crossings, bridges, culverts, signals, and other track infrastructure.

## Community Investments

In 2023, CN contributed to many Alberta-based organizations, including:

**UMOJA COMMUNITY MOSAIC** Umoja started in 2010 as a drop-in soccer club for Calgary's immigrant and low-income children. Today, Umoja provides weekly soccer programming and summer camps as well as a culturally appropriate food and nutrition program for low-income and underserved Calgarians. Umoja also offers after-school programming and tutoring.

**BANFF CENTRE FOR THE ARTS** CN scholarships at Banff Centre for the Arts reduce financial barriers for people accepted into one of the Centre's Indigenous Leadership Management programs, providing a direct, positive impact on diversity in the community.

**ALBERTA ADAPTABILITIES ASSOCIATION** AdaptAbilities champions inclusion for kids and adults living with visible and invisible disabilities by delivering essential programs for individuals with diverse abilities and their families. CN supports the organization's bursary fund so financial circumstances are not a barrier to attending AdaptAbilities' programs.

**FIELD OF CROSSES MEMORIAL PROJECT** Each November, 3,500 crosses are erected in a park along Memorial Drive, in Calgary, to pay tribute to the thousands of Southern Albertans who made the ultimate sacrifice defending our freedom.

**JASPER FOOD BANK SOCIETY** The Jasper Food Bank is a volunteer-run, non-profit association that provides food and basic personal care items to Jasperites in need. The Jasper Food Bank helps relieve hunger and draw attention to the problems associated with hunger through awareness and community resources.
